(Teacher Instructions)

Explain to the students that they are in France visiting a friend/keypal/etc. One day, the student and their friends go window shopping. As they check out the many goods available for sale, the friends talk about their possessions: what they have, what they don't have, and what they want.

Tell the students that they will see 14 objects (from the *le lèche vitrine images Power Point file*) representing what they saw on the shopping trip. After each object is shown, students will identify the name of the object from the list below and write the name in the table provided. Then the students will check the appropriate box next to the item to indicate whether or not the student has the object in question, or wants to have it.
