## UNDERSTANDING LABELS

Read the instructions from the medicine bottle. Then answer the questions that follow.

Medicine A

For headaches and other temporary pain.

Dose: Adults and children over 12, one or two tablets every 4 hours.

Children under the age of 12 should not take this medication.

Medicine B

For upset stomachs

Dose: Adults, 2 teaspoons every four hours for nausea.

Children 4-12 years, 1 teaspoon every four hours for nausea.

Children under the age of 4 should not take this medication.
