
FUNCTION TABLES

A function table has two columns: input and output. Look at the rule at the top of each table. It tells you what to do to the numbers in the input column to get the numbers in the output column.

Examples: The rule for the function table below is $3 \times a = b$. This means you multiply each number in the input column by 3 to get the number in the output column.

Rule: $3 \times a = b$		
Input (a)	Output (b)	
1	3-	1 × 3
3	9-	3×3
7	21	7×3
